### Recreation

Some outdoor recreation (hunting, fishing, golf, boating, hiking)

Outdoor recreation involving 5 or fewer people outside your household (camping, beaches, etc.)

- Outdoor group rec. sports activities (50 or fewer people)
- Recreational facilities at <50% capacity (gyms, public pools, etc.)
- Professional sports without audience participation (horseracing, baseball, etc.)

Resume all recreational activity

### Gatherings (social, spiritual)

- None
- Drive-in spiritual service with one household per vehicle

Gather with no more than 5 people outside your household per week

Allow gatherings with no more than 50 people

Allow gatherings with >50 people

### Travel

Essential travel and limited non-essential travel for Phase I permissible activities

Essential travel and limited non-essential travel for Phase I & II permissible activities

Resume non-essential travel

Continue non-essential travel

### Business/Employers

- Essential businesses open
- Existing construction that meets agreed upon criteria
- Landscaping
- Auto/RV/boat/ORV sales
- Retail (curb-side pick-up orders only)
- Car washes
- Pet walkers

- Remaining manufacturing
- Additional construction phases
- In-home/domestic services (nannies, housecleaning, etc.)
- Retail (in-store purchases allowed with restrictions)
- Real estate
- Professional services/office-based businesses (telework remains strongly encouraged)
- Hair and nail salons/barbers
- Pet grooming
- Restaurants/taverns <50% capacity table size no larger than 5 (no bar-area seating)

- Restaurants/taverns <75% capacity/ table size no larger than 10
- Bar areas in restaurant/taverns at <25% capacity
- Movie theaters at <50% capacity
- Customer-facing government services (telework remains strongly encouraged)
- Libraries
- Museums
- All other business activities not yet listed except for nightclubs and events with greater than 50 people

- Nightclubs
- Concert venues
- Large sporting events
- Resume unrestricted staffing of worksites, but continue to practice physical distancing and good hygiene

\* High-risk populations are currently defined by CDC as: persons 65 years of age and older; people of all ages with underlying medical conditions (particularly not well controlled), including people with chronic lung disease or moderate to severe asthma, people who have serious heart conditions, people who are immunocompromised, people with severe obesity, people with diabetes, people with chronic kidney disease undergoing dialysis, and people with liver disease; people who live in a nursing home or long-term care facility.

# Phase 3- Required application components

1. Health officer's recommendation to the Board of Health. Documentation of the vote of the Board of Health, including the motion and the vote totals.
2. Letters from all hospitals used by the county certifying their bed capacity for COVID-19 patients and PPE supplies.
3. Documentation of the vote of the county commission, including the vote totals.
4. Summary of:
  - COVID-19 testing site information.
  - Data on median number of days from onset of illness to COVID-19 specimen collection date.
  - Testing data for each of the previous four weeks.
  - LHJ's resources to perform case and contact investigations.
  - Information on isolation and quarantine facilities.
  - Resources for supporting persons in *home* isolation/quarantine.
  - LHJ's capacity to perform outbreak investigations in congregate living situations and workplaces.

# Phase 3 Application – Data

<b>COVID-19 Activity</b>	Incidence of new cases reported during prior two weeks ( <i>measured by specimen collection date, and to account for the lag in reporting, the two week period starts 6 days prior to the current date</i> )	Target: <25 cases / 100,000 / 14 days
	Trends in hospitalizations for lab-confirmed COVID-19	Target: flat or decreasing
	Reproductive rate (if available)	Target: $Re < 1$
<b>Healthcare system readiness</b>	% licensed beds occupied by patients (i.e., hospital census relative to licensed beds)	Targets: Green: <80% (Yellow: 81-90%; Red: >90%)
	% licensed beds occupied by suspected and confirmed COVID-19 cases	Target: Green: <10% (Yellow: 11-20%; Red: >20%)
<b>Testing</b>	Average number of tests performed per day during the past week (or average % tests positive for COVID-19 during the past week)	Target: 50 times the number of cases (or 2%)
	<i>Median</i> time from symptom onset to specimen collection among cases during the past week	Target: median <2 days
<b>Case and contact investigations</b>	Percent of cases reached by phone or in person within 24 hours of receipt of positive lab test report	Target: 90%
	Percent of contacts reached by phone or in person within 48 hours of receipt of positive lab test report on a case	Target: 80%
	Percent of cases being contacted daily (by phone or electronically) during their isolation period	Target: 80%
	Percent of contacts being contacted daily (by phone or electronically) during their quarantine period	Target: 80%
<b>Protecting high-risk populations</b>	Number of outbreaks reported by week (defined as 2 or more non-household cases epidemiologically linked within 14 days in a workplace, congregate living, or institutional setting)	Target: 0 for small counties (<75,000), 1 for medium counties (75,000-300,000), 2 for large counties (>300,000), 3 for very large counties (>1 million)

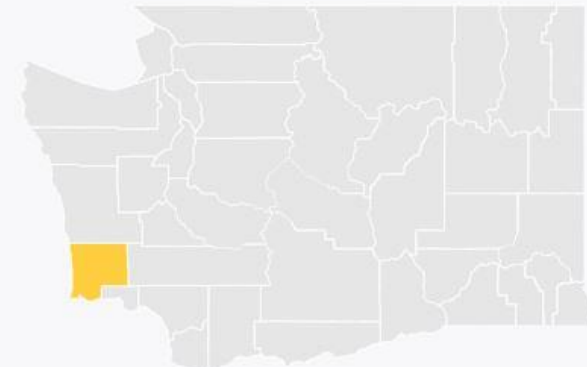
This map shows the current phases and the key metrics used to determine county readiness to move between phases. Select a county to see the status of key metrics for that particular county, or select a key metric for additional detail.

# Congregate Living & Workplaces

- Daily calls to all congregate living facilities
- Education/outreach to congregate workplaces including all canneries
- Mobile strike team to provide on-site testing at long term care, skilled nursing facilities, and congregate workplaces (if needed)

# COVID-19 Testing Capacity

## Drive through testing

- Partnership between the Emergency Operations Center, Pacific County Departments Health, General Admin, DCD, Sheriff, Public Works), South Bend Fire Department, Ocean Beach Hospital, Willapa Harbor Hospital.
- Open to ANYONE with symptoms

\*Symptoms include: Fever, cough, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, chills, shaking/chills, muscle pain, headache, sore throat, new loss of taste or smell, nausea, and/or nasal congestion
