

Pacific County Average Case Rate (100k/population/14 days)





Variants

- Modeling data show that B.1.1.7 (United Kingdom) has become the dominant strain in Washington.
 - It is more transmissible and likely poses an increased risk of severe illness.
- B.1.1.7 (UK), B.1.427 & B.1.429 (California), and P.1 (Brazil) have all been found in samples taken from positive cases in Pacific County
- Finding variants in our population does not change how we respond, but it does reinforce the need for everyone in Washington to be diligent in the four W's – wear a mask, wash your hands, watch your distance and get WA Notify.

SARS-CoV-2 Lineages* Circulating in Washington State



Above left: The chart above shows the biweekly proportions of the most common SARS-CoV-2 lineages circulating in Washington grouped in two-week intervals. Proportions are calculated using data which are subject to change over time and will be updated as more data becomes available.

Above right: The table above lists the current VOIs and VOCs and the most common co-circulating SARS-CoV-2 lineages in the United States based on proportion. Percentages are based on samples collected between January 24, 2021 and March 20, 2021. The most recent data are subject to change as specimens from that period are still being processed. Samples targeted for sequencing due to clinical test characteristics suggestive of B.1.1.7 are excluded.


Are COVID Vaccines Effective?

COVEY

Yes.

- COVID-19 vaccines protect against COVID-19 infection both with and without symptoms.
- In one study, regular testing of health care workers, first responders and other essential frontline workers showed the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines were 90% effective against COVID-19 infections, regardless of symptom status.
- Another US study showed 80% reduction in asymptomatic infection among those who had been vaccinated with Pfizer or Moderna, and an Israeli study showed a 94% reduction in asymptomatic infection with the Pfizer vaccine.
- The data shows us vaccines are very good at preventing COVID-19 illness, but they're not 100% perfect no vaccine is. That is why people who are fully vaccinated still need to wear face coverings in certain settings (like bigger gatherings).


Take prevention measures

Fully vaccinated people: wear a mask
Unvaccinated people: wear a mask, stay 6 feet
apart, and wash your hands.

- Safety levels assume the recommended prevention measures are followed, both by the individual and the venue (if applicable).
- CDC cannot provide the specific risk level for every activity in every community. It is important to consider your own personal situation and the risk to you, your family, and your community before venturing out.

Fully vaccinated individuals can participate in outdoor activities and recreation without a mask, except in certain crowded settings and venues.

People are considered fully vaccinated ≥ 2 weeks after they have received the second dose in a 2-dose series (Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna), or ≥ 2 weeks after they have received a single-dose vaccine (Johnson and Johnson).

Vaccines for adolescents and children

- Update: Pfizer expects FDA to soon approve vaccine for 12+.
- Currently Pfizer is the only COVID-19 vaccine authorized for people 16 years and older.
 - Moderna is authorized for people 18 years and older.
- Those age 16 or 17 will need consent from a parent or guardian to get the vaccine, unless they are legally emancipated.
- Moderna, Pfizer, and Johnson & Johnson are all currently running trials among teens age 12-17.

Stay Connected The Emergency Broadband Benefit Program - Helping people stay connected during the COVID-19 pandemic

- The Federal Communications Commission announced that on May 12, eligible households will be able to enroll through an approved provider or by visiting https://getemergencybroadband.org.
- The program will provide \$50 per month for broadband service (\$75 per month if households are on Tribal lands) and a one-time discount of up to \$100 for an internet-connected device.
- The program will run until it runs out of funds or 6 months after HHS declares an end to the COVID public health emergency, whichever is sooner.

COVID-19 Update

To reduce the spread of COVID-19, the SmileMobile program is implementing new recommendations for infection control. All these changes and precautions are to keep you, your family, and the dental team safe and healthy.

When you call for an appointment, you'll be asked basic health screening questions to make sure you are healthy and ready for an appointment.

To keep you safe, all areas of the SmileMobile will be cleaned and disinfected frequently and hand sanitizer will also be available. You will see certain precautions in place for physical distancing and when you arrive you will be asked to wait in your car until your exam.

Restaurant Revitalization Fund

The American Rescue Plan Act established the Restaurant Revitalization Fund (RRF) to provide funding to help restaurants and other eligible businesses keep their doors open. This program will provide restaurants with funding equal to their pandemic-related revenue loss up to \$10 million per business and no more than \$5 million per physical location. Recipients are not required to repay the funding as long as funds are used for eligible uses no later than March 11, 2023.
