# Mask/Face Coverings Orders



There are three (3) face covering orders in place:

The governor's Safe Start order and the Department of Labor & Industries require employers to provide at no cost appropriate face coverings or masks that must be worn by ***all employees who don't work alone.***

The Secretary of Health has ordered ***all individuals to wear a face covering*** in any indoor public setting or when outdoors and unable to maintain 6 feet of physical distance from others.

The governor's statewide order directing ***businesses to require and enforce*** the use of face coverings by all customers or clients.

# Implementing face covering requirements for businesses

If a customer or visitor is not wearing a face covering, businesses should take the following steps:

- A business representative or employee should ***politely educate*** the customer or visitor about the public health requirement to wear a mask or face covering. Businesses may choose to keep a supply of disposable masks to offer customers who do not have one.
- If the individual still declines to wear a mask or face covering, the business representative or employee should ***politely inquire as to whether the person has a medical condition or disability that prevents them from wearing a mask.*** Businesses CANNOT inquire about the details about a person's specific medical condition or disability and CANNOT ask for proof or documentation.
- For customers who are unable to wear a face covering, ***businesses are encouraged to offer some kind of accommodation*** for the customer such as curbside pickup, delivery or a scheduled appointment when physical distancing can be ensured.













# Implementing face covering requirements for businesses cont.

- If a customer or individual refuses to wear a face covering but does not have a medical condition or disability that prevents them from wearing a mask, they should be ***politely told that the business cannot serve them and that they need to leave the premises***. Under no circumstances should the business representative attempt to physically block an individual from entering or physically remove them from the premises.
- If the individual refuses to leave, the business representative should ***follow whatever procedures they normally follow*** if an individual refuses to leave the establishment when asked to do so (including contacting local law enforcement to indicate that the individual is trespassing)

**Customer complaints:** Customers who are concerned that a business is not adequately enforcing the face mask order or other Safe Start requirements can submit an anonymous complaint.

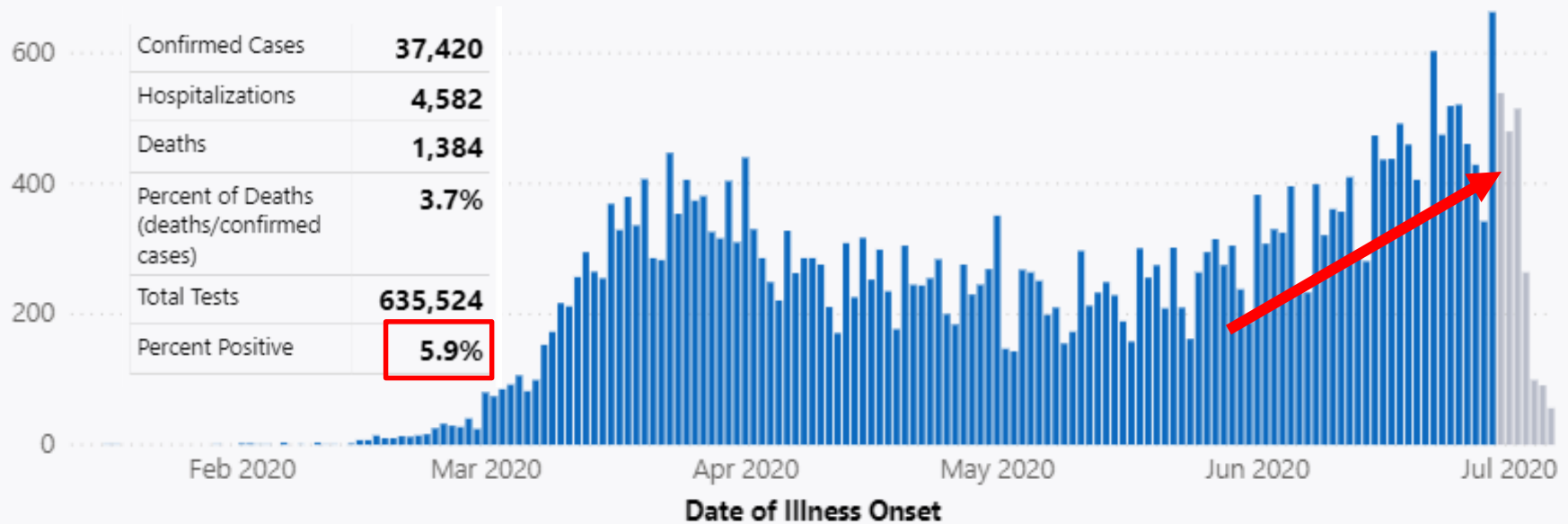

# Event Requirements in Phase 3

## SAFE START WASHINGTON: **What's Open?**

**PHASE 3**

All activities in Phases 1 & 2 are allowed, in addition to the following ...

### Recreation

Outdoor group recreational sports activities  
(50 or fewer people)

Recreational facilities at <50% capacity  
(gyms, public pools, etc.)

### Gatherings

Allow gatherings with no more than 50 people

Indoor spiritual or religious services up to 50%  
of capacity or 400 individuals (whichever is less).  
Choirs not allowed.

### Travel

Resume non-essential travel

### Business

- Restaurants/taverns at <75% capacity, table size no larger than 10
- Bar areas in restaurant /taverns at <25% capacity
- Theaters at <50% capacity
- Customer-facing government services (telework remains strongly encouraged)
- Libraries
- Museums
- All other business activities not yet listed except for nightclubs and events with greater than 50 people

▶ Please follow all applicable guidelines and requirements

▶ Staying home is still safest

▶ When out: keep 6 feet of distance, wear a face covering, and stay local

## Key Points to consider when planning Events in Phase 3

- Events must be less than 50 people (including event staff)
- Must complete safety plan that includes how the event will ensure:
  - Proper sanitation, handwashing, etc.
  - Event staff training
  - Signage
  - Social distancing
  - Mask wearing

# Schools Re-opening Workgroup

- Screening and temp check
- Face coverings
- Physical distancing and spacing
- Cleaning & ventilation
- Staff training/education
- Transportation
- Positive cases/outbreak
- Kids with other symptoms at school
- Childcare
- Food services
- Scheduling

- Equity- Special education, McKinney Vento, Non English Speakers, etc.
