PCEMA to Update Pacific County Hazard Mitigation Plan

The Pacific County Emergency Management Agency is working with Two Rivers Emergency Management to update their multi-jurisdictional hazard mitigation plan under FEMA. The plan, known as the Pacific County Hazard Mitigation Plan, will assess natural hazards' risk and vulnerabilities to the county, municipalities, school districts, and many other organizations and provide recommendations to increase their resiliency.

Once I am vaccinated, do I need to still wear a mask and socially distance?

The answer is yes!

PROPERLY WEAR A MASK & SOCIAL DISTANCE

Here's how:

Be sure to have a cloth, shield or medical grade mask handy when entering public places. The masks must cover your nose and mouth and be worn when closer than 6 feet to a person.

Social distancing, also called physical distancing, is a form of non-pharmaceutical intervention, which downtrends the spread of contagious diseases simply by keeping people "apart" from each other.

When you Get Your COVID-19 Vaccination You Should Receive a Vaccination Record Card

This card is not only proof that you got your shot, but it can also help you keep track of your vaccine information. This information is important to ensure you get the correct second dose — at the right time.


Your vaccine record card will tell you: Which type of vaccine you received (Pfizer, Moderna, or Johnson & Johnson). When you got your first dose. When to go back for your second dose (if needed). Your vaccine provider's name or clinic site.

You might want to keep it in your wallet so that it is always with you. For a backup, you can also use your smartphone to take a photo of the front and back of the card.

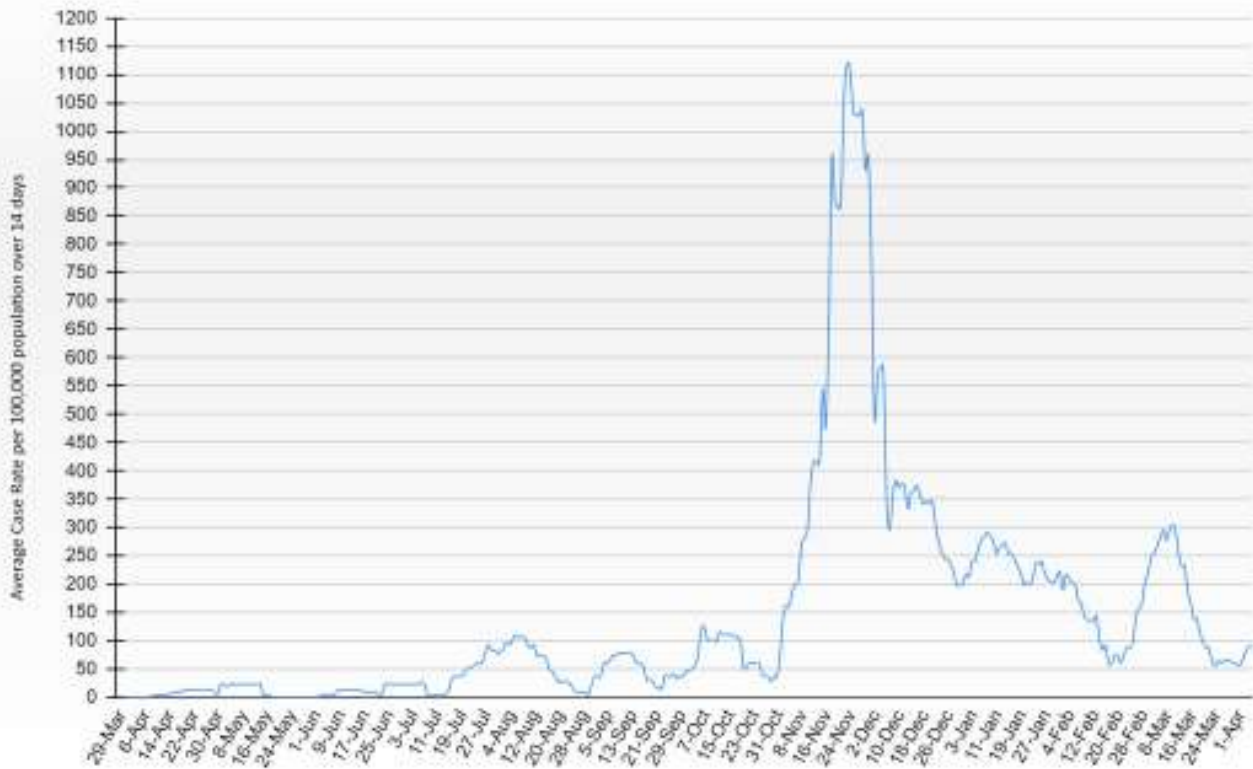
