Gov. Jay Inslee's May 4 Press Conference

The governor provided an update on the state's ongoing response to the COVID-19 pandemic, announcing a two-week pause on movement in the [Healthy Washington: Roadmap to Recovery](#) reopening plan. Under the pause, every county will remain in its [current phase](#). At the end of two weeks, each county will be re-evaluated. Inslee was joined by Umair Shah, MD, MPH, secretary, Department of Health; Jeffrey Duchin, MD, health officer, Public Health–Seattle & King County; and Nick Streuli, executive director of external affairs, Office of the Governor. Are COVID Vaccines Effective?

Yes.



- COVID-19 vaccines protect against COVID-19 infection – both with and without symptoms.
- In one study, regular testing of health care workers, first responders and other essential frontline workers showed the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines were 90% effective against COVID-19 infections, regardless of symptom status.
- Another US study showed 80% reduction in asymptomatic infection among those who had been vaccinated with Pfizer or Moderna, and an Israeli study showed a 94% reduction in asymptomatic infection with the Pfizer vaccine.
- The data shows us vaccines are very good at preventing COVID-19 illness, but they're not 100% perfect – no vaccine is. That is why people who are fully vaccinated still need to wear face coverings in certain settings (like bigger gatherings).

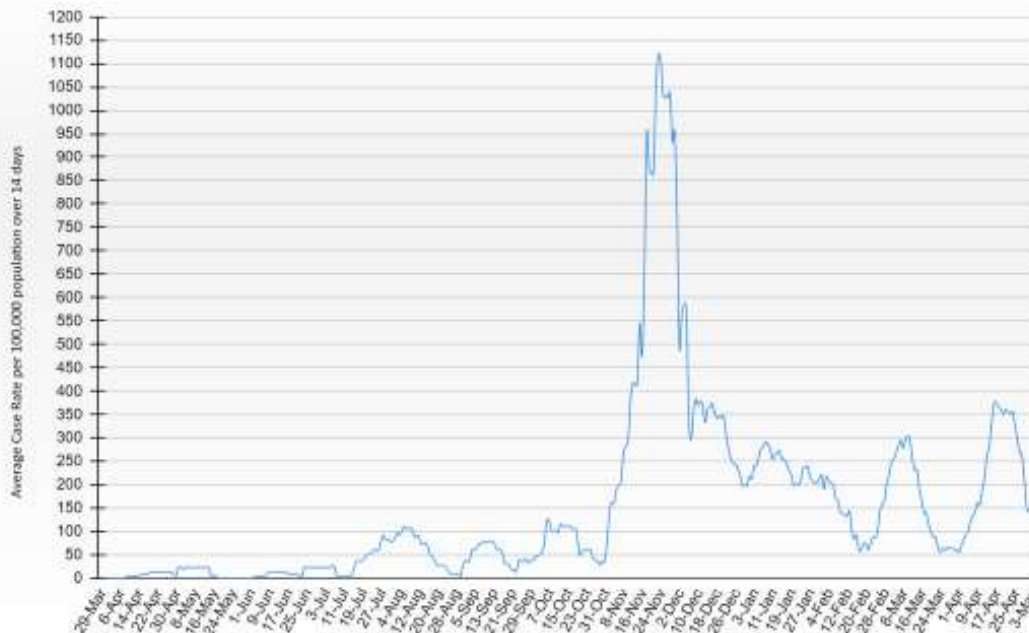
Inslee Announces Update to Spectator Event and Religious Organization Guidance
