As of August 30, **73.3%** of the population **12 and up** has received at least one dose.

This percent includes aggregate data from the Department of Defense and Department of Veterans Affairs and is higher than the DOH data dashboard

As of August 30, 73.3% of Washingtonians 12 and older have received at least one dose of COVID-19 vaccine. This number is higher than the DOH data dashboard because it includes state Immunization Information System (IIS) data, as well as aggregate data from the Department of Defense (DoD) and Veterans Affairs (VA):

4,783,757 people with at least one dose (4,629,756 IIS + 154,001 DoD and VA)

6,529,327 (Population 12 and older, 2020 Office of Financial Management estimates)





Pacific County Cases by Zip Code



- A new report released by Cowlitz County Health Department shows COVID-19 vaccination is significantly reducing the risk of hospitalization among residents in SW Washington.
- The analysis included residents of Cowlitz, Clark, Lewis, Pacific, Skamania and Wahkiakum counties who were hospitalized for COVID-19 from March 22 to June 27, 2021.
- The analysis found the risk of being hospitalized for COVID-19 was reduced by 90% for residents 65 years and older who were fully vaccinated. Of those 65 years and older who were partially vaccinated, the risk of being hospitalized was reduced by 75%.

The data showed 91% of hospitalized residents 45 to 64 years old were unvaccinated. For comparison, 49% of the population in that age group in the region were unvaccinated.

- This includes those who you have been in close contact with for longer than 15 minutes, up to 48 hours before you had symptoms.
- Public health will notify those people about their exposure to the virus- we will not tell them about you.
- We have resources to help you and your family during your isolation or quarantine including grocery shopping, housing, rental assistance and more.
