Vaccination Numbers

As of December 20, 82.2% of Washingtonians 12 and older have received at least one dose of COVID-19 vaccine and 75.6% of people 12 and older are fully vaccinated. This number is higher than the DOH data dashboard because it includes state Immunization Information System (IIS) data, as well as aggregate data from the Department of Defense (DoD) and Veterans Affairs (VA): 5,367,862 people with at least one dose (5,197,957 IIS + 169,905 DoD and VA)

6,529,327 (Population 12 and older, 2020 Office of Financial Management estimates)
4,936,580 people are fully vaccinated (4,779,835 IIS + 156,745 DoD and VA)

If you test positive for COVID-19 (*isolate*)

Everyone, regardless of vaccination status

- Stay home for 5 days.
- If **no symptoms** or symptoms are resolving after 5 days, you can leave your house. *If you have a fever, continue to stay home until fever resolves.*
- **Must** wear a mask around others for 5 more days, then continue to follow state requirements for masks in indoor public settings and workplaces.

If you were in close contact with someone who has COVID-19 (*quarantine*)

If you:

- Have been **boosted** OR **recently completed vaccination**:
 - Received your second dose of Pfizer or Moderna vaccine within the last 6 months OR
 - Received the single-dose J&J vaccine within the last 2 months

And have **no symptoms**:

- Should wear a mask around others for 10 days, then continue to follow state requirements for masks in indoor public settings and workplaces.
- Test on day 5

If symptoms develop, get tested and stay home until you receive results.

If you:

- Are **not boosted** OR have **not recently completed vaccination**:
 - Received your second dose of Pfizer or Moderna vaccine more than 6 months ago OR
 - Received the single-dose J&J vaccine more than 2 months ago
- Are **unvaccinated**

And have **no symptoms**:

- **Stay home for 5 days** and **must** wear a mask around others for 5 more days.
- If cannot quarantine, **must** wear a mask around others for 10 days.
- Test on day 5
- After quarantine ends, continue to follow state requirements for masks in indoor public settings and workplaces.

If symptoms develop, get tested and stay home until you receive results.

Weather Update From PCEMA

After a phone consultation with the National Weather Service, PCEMA is happy to report that temperatures for most of the western/coastal portions of Pacific County are expected to move above freezing overnight tonight and rain is expected to begin falling. Temperatures are expected to remain above freezing for the remainder of the week. We could initially see some wintry precipitation in the eastern parts of the county before the snow level rises to 1000 feet by midmorning tomorrow and we could see some refreezing overnight in those higher elevations near Lebam and Frances.

We are suspending our warming shelter operations effective immediately. We wish we had the ability to maintain these shelters on an ongoing basis, unfortunately we simply do not have the bandwidth or the locations to be able to do so. Pacific County Health and Human Service and Peninsula Poverty Response along with other partners in the community will continue their excellent work in reaching out and serving the most vulnerable segments of our population. PCEMA would also like to recognize Darian Johnson from Pacific County Health and Human Services, in particular, for her hard work in this process.

PCEMA would like to once again thank all of the partners within our amazing community who made these shelter operations possible. Grays Harbor College, for the use of their facilities, the American Red Cross and Willapa Harbor Hospital for the use of their supplies, Pacific County Health and Human Services, Peninsula Poverty Response, and a huge list of volunteers that is too long to name here. Their cooperation and support are greatly appreciated!

Finally, a request for continued caution and patience on the roadways. As we warm up things are going to remain slick and as we develop slush on the roads travel will remain treacherous please be careful!
