## Testing (and re-testing) for COVID-19

If you test positive for COVID-19 using an at-home antigen test, you do not need to confirm your result with a PCR test. Antigen tests are unlikely to produce false positives.

Antigen tests are specific. They produce a positive result when they detect pieces of the protein from the surface of the virus that causes COVID-19. The tests do require a certain amount of virus to be present (a higher viral load) to produce a positive result. When viral loads are lower, the tests may not be able to detect the infection and produce a false-negative.

If you test positive, isolate at home for at least 5 days and until you've been fever-free for at least 24 hours (without fever-reducing medicine) and your other symptoms are improving. For the next 5 days, be sure to wear a mask anytime you're around others and avoid contact with people who are at high risk for COVID-19 illness.

If you test negative but have symptoms you should test again at least 24 hours later to confirm the result. Be sure to isolate at home while you wait to retest. If you've been in close contact with someone who has COVID-19 and develop symptoms, you should assume you have COVID-19 and isolate at home – even if your at-home test result is negative.

### At-Home COVID-19 Test Kits Available!

Pacific County Health Department in partnership with <u>Timberland Regional Library</u> and <u>Shoalwater Bay Medical Clinic</u> is pleased to announce the Pacific County at-home COVID test kit program. This program is in addition to the Washington State (<u>www.sayyescovidhometest.org</u>) and the federal (<u>www.covidtests.gov</u>) at-home test kit programs and is limited to those who live or work in Pacific County. Beginning today, February 9th, individuals can pick up one test kit per person at the locations listed below. Each kit contains 2 rapid COVID tests that people can administer themselves at home. We recommend everyone has a home kit on hand in case they develop symptoms of COVID-19 or in case they are exposed to someone who tests positive. For those testing due to exposure to COVID-19, it is best to wait until day 5 after exposure to ensure the most accurate test results. If individuals

Please note, if you are currently experiencing symptoms and need a test, call the front desk of the location you are picking up at upon arrival and a staff member will bring the kit out to your car- Please do not enter the building if you are symptomatic.



#### When to use your COVID-19 At Home Test:

- If you have COVID-19 symptoms, like a fever or cough, test right away.
   If you were a close contact of someone with COVID-19, wait at least 5 days to
- . If you are testing before a gathering, test right before the gathering, or as close to the event as possible.


