Pacific County Health Department in partnership with Timberland Regional Library and Shoalwater clinic are pleased to announce the Pacific County at-home COVID test kit program. This program is in addition to the Washington State (<a href="www.sayyescovidhometest.org">www.sayyescovidhometest.org</a>) and the federal (<a href="www.covidtests.gov">www.covidtests.gov</a>) at-home test kit programs and is limited to those who live or work in Pacific County. Beginning today, February 9th, individuals can pick up one test kit per household member at the locations listed below. Each kit contains 2 rapid COVID tests that people can administer themselves at home. We recommend everyone has a home kit on hand in case they develop symptoms of COVID-19 or in case they are exposed to someone who tests positive. For those testing due to exposure to COVID-19, it is best to wait until day 5 after exposure to ensure the most accurate test results. Please note, if you are currently experiencing symptoms and need a test, call the front desk once you arrive and a staff member will bring the kit out to your car- do not enter the building if you are symptomatic.





Pacific County Hospitalization due to COVID-19 by vaccination status (March 1, 2021- Present)







- . If you have COVID-19 symptoms, like a fever or cough, test right away.
- If you were a close contact of someone with COVID-19, wait at least 5 days to test.
- If you are testing before a gathering, test right before the gathering, or as close to the event as possible.
